The remaining \$3 supports AAUW Action Fund's 501c4 Capitol Hill Lobby Corps and get-out-the-vote activities. 50-year members are no longer required to pay dues, and we thank those loyal members for their many years of service to women and girls. # Tech Trek—STEM Opportunities for Girls

Tech Trek is a national program by AAUW, and the Storm Lake branch has offered Tech Trek at Buena Vista University for the last 4 years. It is a week-long

science and technology camp for girls between 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade years. Girls spend that week engaged in activities involving designing phone apps,



building a model of a solar car, doing wind generator projects, identifying plants, and more. This year 12 students applied, and 5 students from Des Moines Harding and Waukee were accepted. Tech Trek is supported through grants, and our branch covered the remaining \$50 fee for students from this area. Students who attended last year had a great time and described it as "the best camp ever." We think that the group from this year will enjoy it as much as others have before. We hope to meet at Grand View University in October for that presentation for this year's campers. Watch for more details in the future.

# **AAUW Regional Conference**

AAUW national conferences are very expensive, and AAUW is not likely to offer another one soon. A date and location have not yet been determined. However, an Illinois location has been suggested, because it is a state that has not yet passed laws limiting women's access to health care, and we hope to see information about a conference in June. The rotunda in the Iowa State Capitol has already been reserved for both days, so AAUW Iowa has reserved the west part of the rotunda on April 8, 2020 from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. to mark Equal Pay Day. We plan to have materials about the gender pay gap, membership materials, and Payday candy bars. If you are available during that time, please stop by our table, and help greet the public. This is also an opportunity to visit with the legislators who stop by our table.

# **Capitol Corps at the Iowa State Capitol**

During the last legislative session, AAUW members from central lowa communicated with lowa legislators about issues affecting women and girls by participating in the AAUW lowa Capitol Corps. We have begun to make plans for the 2020 legislative session.

Members will meet for training sometime in November. Capitol Corps participants will receive tips for effective

communication with legislators, information about how to use the legislature's website, the legislative calendar and timelines for 2020, and information, resources and talking points regarding specific legislation and issues.



At that training, members will sign up for dates for contacting members of the legislature about issues that we care about. In most cases, this will mean visiting the capitol building and meeting with members of the legislature face-to-face. There will also be times that making contacts by phone or email will enough.
