DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS

AAUW members must be aware of the violence and trafficking that hold back women and girls (and men), worldwide and in our midst, from achieving their potential. The National Intimate Partner and Sexual Violence Survey recently issued some sobering statistics:

- . Nearly 1 in 2 women and 1 in 5 men have experienced sexual violence victimization other than rape at some point in their lives.
- . 79% of female victims of completed rape report they were first raped before the age of 25
- . 28% of male victims of rape report they were first raped when they were 10 years or younger
- . More than $\frac{1}{2}$ of female and male victims reported they were first stalked before the age of 25.

Grand View University C/U News

Starting with our joint branch meeting in September, the Des Moines branch has partnered several times with the Grand View University C/U (College/University) branch of AAUW.

Des Moines branch members attended a speech on Wednesday, September 17 at 10:45 a.m., in the Sisam Arena for Grand View's Global Visions Week. Dr. Nana Derby, associate professor of criminal justice at Virginia State University, delivered the keynote address entitled "Human Trafficking: A Transnational Crime so Evil."

The Grand View University CU group sponsored a \$tart \$mart salary negotiation workshop on November 10 for students preparing to go into the workforce, co-sponsored by AAUW. The Des Moines Branch supplied refreshments for the 25 students present.

In addition to these events, the GVU branch has also sponsored a forum "Sexism in Gaming." Professors Josh Call (English) and Cyndi Wiley (Art and Design) presented examples and then led a lively discussion on how women are depicted in video games. About 20-25 students attended.

On November 4th, we hosted a screening of the movie *Miss Representation*. This documentary examines how women are portrayed in popular culture, movies, and politics. It is fairly enlightening, and sometimes surprising to students who believe that sexism is "fixed" in our society. About 30 people were in attendance.

Finally, many students from the C/U branch are interested in attending the National Conference for College Women Leaders (NCCWSL) this year, partly due to the success of Ella Heinicke's presentation at the September meeting.

She is a strong advocate for the mentally ill, who include members of her own family, and a trained educator for the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) program. She came armed with statistics to show the progress in Iowa that has been made on behalf of the mentally ill, but a much longer list of needs. Iowa ranks near the bottom of states in its support for the mentally ill.

At the business part of the meeting we voted to send our more recent Branch archives to the State Historical Library in Iowa City where the rest of our archives, and those of the State AAUW, are catalogued and stored. They will be delivered on Nov. 20.

Independent Private Instruction

AAUW Iowa Public Policy Program

In our mission to advance equity for women and girls, the state AAUW board has become concerned that standards for home, charter and private schools remain consistent with standards for public schools.

Briefly, Independent Private Instruction is a new category of home schooling that was approved in 2013 as part of the Education Reform Bill HF 215. It allows for home schooling for one's own and four additional unrelated children. No licensure or preparation is required, nor is notification to the local school district. It is exempt from state laws, rules, and assessment.

HF 2308 would have eliminated this additional extension of Independent Private Instruction to school standards, but it failed to make it out of the Education Committee. This is an issue that AAUW IA would like us to follow and be ready to advocate for.

Report of the September 15th and November 17th Board Meetings

On September 15th, we reviewed the Branch-State board connection questionnaire, determining our biggest challenges are visibility and attracting new members. Our response is to place brochures in public places and to reach out to faculty members at the local C/U partners, Drake, DMU, Mercy College of Health Sciences, Grand View University, and DMACC. We agreed to nominate Charlotte Nelson and Lori

Schrader-Bacher for the AAUW Title IX Award to recognize their work for women and girls at the Iowa Commission on the Status of Women. The pros and cons of the 5:30 p.m. time for general meetings were up for discussion. We would like member feedback.

At the November 17th board meeting we reviewed our recent meetings, made plans for upcoming meetings and the YWRC Christmas Party, and discussed future meeting content. We are in the process of writing up the Title IX nominations.

DMACC FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP DINNER

JoAnne Cook and Faith Sherman attended the DMACC event on October 27th. The dinner recognized scholarship donors and recipients. Our AAUW Lois Dell child development scholarship stands at \$21754.31. There have been seventeen scholarships awarded, totaling \$11,085.84.
