## GRAND VIEW ART PROFESSOR TO SPEAK AT MAY 19 ANNUAL MEETING

Rachel Merrill-Schwaller, Assistant Professor of Art and Design at Grand View University will be our speaker on May 19. "What a Girl Wants: Women Artists and the Influence of the Female Perspective in Art History" will be her topic. The annual meeting will begin at 6:30 with a light supper at the Northwest Community Center, 5110 Franklin Ave.

### Agenda Item

A point of discussion will be how to use our \$4505.76 recovered from the Great Iowa Treasure Hunt. Last year we agreed to hold on to it until after our centennial celebration in case we had unexpected major expenses. Instead our expenses amounted to just \$553.99 for facility rental and cake. We also voted during the year to send \$500 in support of the University of Iowa's planned Tech Trek summer STEM camp for girls that was to be jointly sponsored by AAUW, but that endeavor did not work out at that site and our money was returned. We are in the process of polling members to determine if we approve the motion, made by Amy Getty and recommended by the leader-ship team, to award Grand View senior Ella Heinicke \$500 to attend the NCCWSL in June. Our leadership team has further recommended that we give \$2000 to increase the Lois Dell Child Development scholarship fund at DMACC, and retain the rest for some future project, perhaps supporting girls entering STEM fields.


## ISSUES SURFACE AT STATE AAUW LOBBY DAY

## State AAUW Conference

Our Branch centennial celebration was only the beginning. The State conference continued on Saturday, April 12, at the Blank Park Zoo. It was filled with interesting speakers and resources. Rekha Basu was the terrific keynote speaker, who shared many women's stories of suppression and danger around the world.

"Lens of Faith" was an outstanding panel discussion of issues that women face globally, examined from different faith perspectives. The Rev. Sarai Schnucker Rice moderated the panel, consisting of Dr. Rizwan, Muslim pediatrician, Dr. Nikky-Guninder Kaur Singh, Sikh professor of religion at Colby College, Norene Mostkoff, Jewish President and CEO of HCI Care Services and Visiting Nurse Services of Iowa, and Dr. Kajal Madeka (nee 'Shah), Hindu anthropologist and historian.

Shanna Greene Benjamin assistant professor of English at Grinnell College and AAUW Fellow, spoke about Nellie Y. McKay a co-editor of the Norton Anthology of African American Literature, and the subject of her biography. Kristen Galles, an LAF attorney, talked about her experiences working with Title IX athletic issues. Betsy McDowell was a special guest from the AAUW Board of Directors who shared many new AAUW initiatives and accomplishments.

At the silent auction, which raised \$1403 for AAUW funds, JoAnne Cook's flower arrangement brought in \$25.
