AAUW-IA JOINS THE INTERFAITH ALLIANCE MORAL MONDAY MEETINGS.

Through the month of April, Connie Ryan Terrell, Executive Director of the Interfaith Alliance of Iowa and Action Fund, organized weekly noon meetings at the Capitol with like-minded progressive organizations, legislators, and experts on a number of topics supported by AAUW.

Ruth Anne Petrak, Sharon Gee and Faith Sherman represented our Branch at these meetings. Topics included managed care, budget support for public schools, and medical cannabis.

MARCH 30 BRANCH MEETING LOOKED AT HUMAN TRAFFICKING

Dawn Taylor spoke about the frightening, pervasive and dangerous activities of human trafficking and sexual violence internationally and right here in central Iowa. Who are the traffickers and the victims, how do traffickers control these victims, why don't they seek help, and how can we help? These were some of the issues Dawn discussed. Besides calling 911 if we observe a questionable activity going on, there is a national toll free number, 1-888-3737-888, that is set up to deal specifically with trafficking problems. If you call that number you will get an immediate call back to report your observation.

The Iowa Senate recently passed SF 450 making trafficking a forcible felony, and requiring the Attorney General's office to develop assistance programs, training for law enforcement officers, and the Division of Criminal and Juvenile Justice Planning to collect data to educate about and prevent human trafficking. It lacks adequate funding, according to Taylor. The House has not yet passed a similar bill. We are encouraged to contact our representative to advocate for this issue.

Kathie Farris, President of the Indianola AAUW Branch, spoke to us about the AAUW Tech Trek summer camp for middle school girls they are co-sponsoring with Simpson College. It will be held June 21-27. Eighth grade girls from Weeks, Brody, and McCombs schools in Des Moines and Indianola, Interstate 35, Carlisle, Southeast Warren, Norwalk and Martinsdale-St. Marys schools in Warren County have been accepted. Through hands-on workshops, exposure to female role models, and educational field trips, the girls will be encouraged to see themselves as future scientists, engineers, mathematicians, and computer scientists. The Indianola Branch received a \$10,000 AAUW grant, and the 55 girls will pay just \$50 to attend.

Our Branch voted to contribute \$500 to the program. Sharon Gee, Brittany Cottrill, Barb Zimany and Faith Sherman have volunteered to help. If you would like to join them for a morning or afternoon of that week, please contact Faith Sherman at 278-2242.

We voted to give \$75 to the three Branch members who represented us at the state AAUW conference April 10-11 at the University of Northern Iowa: Barb Zimany, Mary Harlan, and Faith Sherman. Amy Getty, as State Membership Chair, also attended the conference.
